When getting frames drawn out, pack all your frames as tightly together as possible in the center of the box. Don't space them out at all until drawn. That will help limit the burr comb.

Are the new flow frames coated in wax, to encourage acceptance by the bees, or do they come as raw plastic? They are raw plastic. Putting some wax on them greatly helps bees get started, ...

## Bridge Frame Comb Screen

When the beekeeper tries pulling out a beehive part such as a frame with bridge comb on it, the comb may break and falloff. The falling comb is likely to injure or kill bees in the beehive.

Given the space and a need to use it, the bees will extend the comb from the bottom of the comb. In fact I often run smaller frames in the deep brood box, and the bees will extend the comb ...
