

## Can a 2 5G switch be directly plugged into a fiber optic cable

Most modern fiber-enabled network switches require an SFP transceiver module featuring a duplex (two strand) multimode OM3 or duplex single mode OS2 connection with LC connectors. Direct attach ...

Choose an SFP module based on the fiber optic cabling that will be connected to the network switches. SFP transceiver modules almost always require two fiber optic cable strands.

Connect a fiber optic cable to the transceiver, verifying that the correct polarity is maintained. Occasionally, check SFP transceivers for dust, dirt, and damage.

If you're connecting two switches sitting in the same rack, skip fiber altogether and go with a Direct Attach Copper (DAC) cable. These are SFP+ to SFP+ twinax cables that cost less and don't require ...
