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If an optical module cannot be completely inserted into an optical port, turn the optical module over and try again. Cover unconnected optical modules with dust plugs.

Pull out the optical module in the horizontal direction (please use even force when pulling out to avoid damaging the handle), and cover the optical module slot with a dust-proof cap.

You may have to grab onto the bottom (or top) with your fingernail but it should move with little effort. You generally can't do this while a cable is plugged in.

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
