

# Use flexible wire in the distribution box

Flexible cords shall be used only in continuous lengths without splice or tap. Hard service flexible cords No. 12 or larger may be repaired if spliced so that the splice retains the insulation, outer sheath ...

Approved wiring methods range from a rigid, highly impenetrable type of cable, such as Type MI (mineral insulated cable) to a raceway system, such as rigid metallic conduit or intermediate metal ...

Install flexible electrical conduit (FMC/LFMC) to any box. Learn proper cutting, connector installation, and secure locknut tightening for grounding.

Flexible cords shall be connected to devices and fittings so that strain relief is provided which will prevent pull from being directly transmitted to joints or terminal screws.

Because there is a crazy amount of conduit and other crap on the walls, I was planning to use "non-metallic Flex conduit. I can't see any other way to get conduit to this thing.

You don't run flexible cords and flexible cables in raceway, although you may use cord guards or other devices such as cable looms to protect them ...
